Can't find what you want? Interlibrary Loan (ILL) will order it for you from another Library. Work at a distance? You are eligible for home delivery.

You may be able to borrow materials at participating libraries from other institutions that you plan to visit in Canada and the U.S.: services.library.ubc.ca

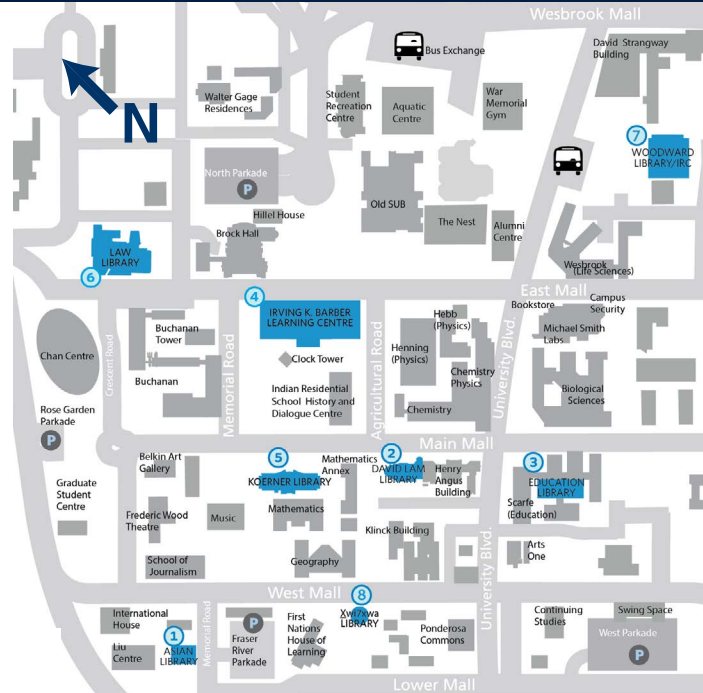
You can book videos, films or DVDs for individual use or for a classroom presentation on a specific date: mediabooking.library.ubc.ca
